



Roles and Responsibilities

EHSS-Phos Program – Emergency Response, Appendix B

The following table outlines the responsibilities for specific groups / roles as required in the ***EHSS-Phos Emergency Response*** Program:

| Role | Responsibility |
|----------------------------------|---|
| General Manager | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Acts as a site sponsor through participation in ERT recognition• Supports ERT participation in training and drills |
| Site ERT Coordinator | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Member of Safety staff responsible for all ERT activities for that facility |
| On Scene Incident Commander (IC) | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Evaluates the site-specific conditions and hazards to determine site-specific response duties to be assigned to the shift ERT group• Assesses situations and, if warranted, declare an emergency• Makes the necessary arrangements for outside assistance to include air medical evacuation and ground medical evacuation, additional fire department services, and hazardous material response |
| Captain | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• ERT member designated to serve in a leadership capacity for his / her team. Directs and controls activities of ERT responders during emergency responses• Documents all response activities using designated form (designated form is determined by the facility)• Ensures emergency response equipment returned and restocked to ready state• Maintains monthly equipment inventory and performs other duties as assigned by the Site ERT Coordinator |
| Lieutenant | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provides on-scene overall direction and control of any response in absence of the Captain• Assists in the monthly equipment inventory and performs other duties as assigned by the Site ERT Coordinator |
| EHS Training Specialist (ERT) | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Responsible for developing and ensuring the delivery of the ERT Training Program |
| Phosphates ERT Safety Specialist | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Supports ERT program and site participation from a Business Unit (BU) perspective |
